#### **ANNUAL MEETING**

#### **GCOLA CHAIR**

• Birznieks announced he will resign as Chair immediately following the Annual Meeting. Motion by Birznieks and second by Eliason to elect Steve Frawley as Chair following Birznieks' resignation. Motion approved.

## AIS COMMITTEE

Thoele met with AIS staff from Cass County, Crow Wing County, DNR and City of Lake Shore.
 Cass and Crow Wing are short-staffed so focusing on weekends during peak recreational boating times since fishing people are more educated about AIS detection practices. City of Lake Shore will increase staffing to include Thursdays. A request has been submitted to PLM to complete a



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third AIS inspection of the 23 boat landings. Thoele will research if able to receive information two times a year on the number of violations.

A Round Lake GCOLA member requested a water testing kit, but Eliason stated the results will
not be included in the study.

# GOVERNMENT RELATIONS COMMITTEE

• Frawley is exploring productivity software which make sending emails to government officials easier for members. The environmental omnibus bill did not advance in the legislature.

#### LAKE STEWARD COMMITTEE

• Whitmer reported 65-70 people received 400 trees during the Tree Giveaway. The Lake Steward program has completed eight site visits so far this year and one award has been given out. So far there are 64 recipients of the award. Upcoming efforts include working with the City of Nisswa, and Lake Shore regarding the program implemented by the City of East Gull Lake; asking award recipients to be an ambassador for their neighborhood; sending an email to all members; and focusing on blanketing all property owners on Upper Gull.

# LOON PRESERVATION COMMITTEE

Johnston collected three pounds of lead tackle at the GTLO event at Jack Pine Brewery. The
volunteers for the loon survey were delayed due to the second mating season caused by black
flies. Johnston is seeking approval from the DNR for kiosks at Nisswa and Hole-in-the-Day
public accesses, along with loon nesting signs.
